The meeting was called to order by Dean Hart, and attention was given to the following:


1. Minutes of the meetings of October 6 and 20, 1975, were approved.
2. Professor Ellis distributed the Report of the Ad Hoc Committee on MALSA Admission Demands; Jaime Chaves, spokesman for MALSA, requested immediate faculty action and that the more detailed proposal be distributed to the faculty. The faculty voted to postpone major discussion until a special meeting could be held on Monday, November 10. Notice and agenda for this open meeting will be posted.

Professor Ellis spoke briefly on each of the demands.

3. Professor Flickinger moved that the present form of the Juris Doctor diploma be discontinued and that the one issued prior to 1975 be the official law school diploma. Motion carried unanimously.
4. Motion to support the Dean's recommendations regarding plans for the building addition carried.
5. Professor Utton recognized the Dean's fifth year in the decanal position.
6. Upon recommendation of the Appointments Committee, motion to reserve one faculty position for visiting members carried. Faculty voted to table the decision to allot any additional position to the Clinical program.

Meeting adjourned.

REPORT OF AD HOC COMMITTEE ON MALSA ADMISSION DEMANDS

After discussion, the Committee passed the following motions:

1. That the faculty adopt as a goal for the law school that 50% of the next year's class be Chicano.
2. That the faculty instruct the Admissions Committee to give substantial weight to the recommendations of MALSA on individual Chicano applicants.
3. That one or more students be put on the Admissions Committee as voting members.
4. That the Law School hire more Chicano employees at all levels.
5. That a new position be created for a minority student associate dean who would also carry a one-half teaching load. In selecting this faculty member MALSA, among other groups, be consulted.
