

²A first-year student may elect any of the courses designated by an asterisk. An elective is not required. However, if a first-year student does not elect a course, that student will have, at most, 29 credit hours at the end of his or her first year. That will prevent the student from doing any clinical work until his or her second semester of second year.

³Seminars have a limited enrollment of 12 students except for Water Law which is limited to 20. Students who took Business Planning or Estate Planning in 1975-76 have met the seminar requirement. For 1976-77, Law Review students who write an article, note or comment, of publishable quality and members of the National Moot Court Team who write an acceptable brief will have met the seminar requirement. The faculty advisors of the Law Review and Moot Court Team must certify by the beginning of each student's last semester that the student has produced a publishable law review piece or acceptable brief. Any student who has not written a certifiable piece or brief by that time will not have met the seminar requirement and must take a seminar during his or her final semester.
