MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Dean Hart and the minutes of the meeting of April 18 were approved.

A motion was passed granting Michael Vigil an extension from May 13 to May 27 to complete his paper in Individual Research.

A motion was passed making Programmed Studies a three-hour required firstsemester course in lieu of Family Law. A motion to require students who took Programmed Studies during their first year to take Family Law in the second year failed.

The Curriculum Committee's proposal placing limitations upon the repetition of Clinical Law courses was approved. (See Attachment A)

The tentative curriculum as proposed by the Committee was approved. Attachment B)

The dean announced openings in the deanships at American and Mercer University Schools of Law.

The faculty unanimously passed a resolution urging the dean to (1) require registration at the Law School on the day before classes, and (2) require all students to consult with a faculty member before registering. Strong objections were voiced to the registration system used for the past semester, based primarily upon the ground that any meaningful consultation with students before registration was impossible. It was also noted that one of the results was an inordinate amount of drops and adds which caused confusion and which could have been avoided. Comments were also made about the difficulty it caused in selecting students for classes with limited enrollment.

Meeting adjourned.

ATTACHMENT A

LIMITATIONS ON REPETITION OF CLINICAL COURSES

In order to assure there is educational value in repetition of clinical field experience courses, the following regulations are proposed.

- 1. Law Intern Program.
 - A. No student shall repeat a law intern course under the same supervising attorney, law firm or agency.
 - B. No student shall be allowed to enroll in more than three credit hours from law intern courses without the prior written permission of the director of the clinical program based on a finding of substantial educational value.
- II. In-house Field Experience Courses.
 - A. No student shall repeat the same in-house course without the prior written permission of the course instructor based on a finding of substantial educational value.
 - B. No student shall repeat the same in-house course more than once.
