MINUTES

Dean Hart called the meeting to order, and minutes of the meeting of April 3, 1978, were approved.

The faculty voted favorably on the petition of Diane Fisher for extension until May 12 to remove a grade of Incomplete on a paper.

Professor Desiderio distributed tentative offerings for next academic year as recommended by the Curricula Committee. A motion to delete Individual Research (594) as a first year elective in spring semester failed to carry. There was a motion that the curriculum as submitted (attached) be tentatively adopted. After further discussion, the motion was tabled until the next faculty meeting.

Professor Stelzner moved that all or part of the Advocacy program be transferred to the second semester, and if this motion is acceptable, that the Curricula Committee be directed to redesign the first year curriculum. Motion failed.

It is hoped that the student body can respond to the tentative offerings by Friday, April 21 and that another faculty meeting can be scheduled at an early date.

Professor Minzner presented recommendations of the Awards Committee for the Awards Banquet, which is scheduled for Wednesday, April 26. Votes by the faculty settled questions regarding the discretionary awards, the outcome of which is to be revealed after the Awards Banquet.
