Dean Hart called the meeting to order; minutes of the meeting of March 19, 1979, were approved.

Announcements concerning deanship searches at other law schools were made.

The faculty then turned its attention to the curriculum for the coming academic year. Regarding first year subjects, a motion to increase Torts to four credits carried and one to award one credit for a successful moot court brief failed. First year students wanting to take an elective that would give them more than sixteen hours in the second semester must obtain permission from Winograd, but it is the sense of the faculty that permission should be given unless there is some reason for denying it.

Regarding upperclass curriculum, the faculty approved a motion to include one course in Law and Economics, taught by Libecap, with a second course to be considered at a later date.

After discussion, headed by Hermann and Norwood, of the proposed Advanced Litigation Program, the faculty voted to accept the curriculum as amended (attached).
