MINUTES

Dean Desiderio called the meeting to order; minutes of the meeting of September 24, 1979, were approved as amended.

Desiderio introduced the new student representatives and Ed Macy, attorney with the Clinical Program.

The faculty was reminded to submit out-of-state travel requests for attendance at the A.A.L.S. Conference to be held in Phoenix, Arizona. Also, the State Bar Convention will be held at the Hilton Hotel on October 18, 19, and 20.

The University of Hong Kong is seeking applicants for their Senior Lecture-ships; the University of Maryland at Baltimore has an opening for the position of Chancellor on the Baltimore City campus; the University of Akron is looking for a Dean of the School of Law; and Indiana University at Indianapolis is seeking a Visiting Professor of Law/ABA Consultant on Legal Education.

Goldberg led the discussion regarding the Bondurant Scholarships and moved that the proposal, with amendments, which was tabled at the meeting of September 24, 1979, be adopted. A motion to amend 3a. to extend to top half, instead of top third, failed. The faculty approved the deletion of the fourth and fifth sentences of the proposal dealing with time spans. Also, the 7th sentence was amended to read, "Where the scholarship is awarded for less than a year or under special circumstances, the committee will consider applications for less than a year." In special cases, the proposal will allow a partial stipend with allowance for adjustment. Copies of the Bondurant Proposal, with amendments, will be distributed by Goldberg, and a committee will be appointed to begin the process of attracting applications.

Students have presented petitions for blocks of scheduled time for meetings, make-ups, programs, etc. An attempt will be made to work out the schedule accordingly.

Parnall moved that the top ten students of the May 1979 graduating class be awarded the Order of the Coif. Motion carried.
