MINUTES

Dean Desiderio called the meeting to order, and minutes of the meeting of December 10, 1979, were approved. The Dean made announcements regarding:

- 1. University of Puget Sound and Whittier College are looking for a dean for their respective law schools.
- National Endowment for the Humanities will conduct Summer Humanities Seminars for Law Teachers. Kay Nauyok has details.
- Faculty is asked to notify the Dean as to sabbatical leave during next school year.
- 4. On February 3rd and 4th, Dr. Jorge Carpizo, of a University in Mexico City, will be visiting this school. His visit may be the first of a proposed visiting professor exchange program.
- 5. Professor R. P. Nadin-Davis, of the University of Ottowa, has agreed to lecture in the area of criminal law or criminal procedure around February 12.
- 6. There will be a faculty meeting on Monday, January 28, to consider probation and suspension of students, following which the Committee on Promotions and Tenure (all full-time faculty) will meet.

The faculty then considered the petition for readmission of Marcia LeClaire. The recommendation by the Admissions Committee that she be readmitted carried. A motion to allow her to take fewer than twelve hours at the Dean's or the Associate Dean's discretion failed. Professor Muir suggested that the rule regarding full-time loads be examined on a broader rather than an individual basis.

Time extensions for the removal of Incomplete grades were voted upon as follows: Alfred Perez and Christian Eaby until the end of the spring semester, and Kenneth Martinez until February 1, 1980. Motions carried.

Dean Desiderio explained the conditions of allowing Tom Rutherford to be away from classes during the current legislative session:

- a) he must satisfactorily complete the fall semester with at least a 2.5 average;
- b) permission applies only to the 30-day session;
- c) he must meet at least once a week with individual faculty members;
- d) he must complete his assignments.

The present policy of allowing withdrawal from classes was delineated as:

A law school course may be dropped by a student for any reason during the first eight weeks of the semester, unless the instructor has indicated in advance that a shorter withdrawal period (or none at all) will apply in a particular course.

A law school course may be dropped with the instructor's permission from the ninth week of classes through the final day of classes.

A law school course may be dropped after the last day of classes only under extraordinary circumstances and only with permission of the instructor and the Dean or Associate Dean.

This policy was affirmed for the spring semester. Professor Hart suggested that the Student Affairs Committee draft a formal Policy on Withdrawal from Classes.

Material regarding the school calendar was distributed, as attached. A Calendar review as to any change in calendars will be considered in a month. (attached)

The Dean and the Associate Dean will meet with the 2d Year Class at 11:30, Rm. 2401, on Friday, January 25. Anyone who wishes may attend.

Meeting adjourned.


