Dean Desiderio called the meeting to order; minutes of the meeting of April 21, 1980, were approved.

Announcements by Dean: South Dakota School of Law is looking for a dean. Frank Walwer, Associate Dean at Columbia, has become dean at Tulsa College of Law.

The Honors and Awards Committee's recommendation was voted upon and carried: Semester relative standings will be abolished. Chairman Schwartz stated that the committee sees several areas which should be approached, i.e., using C, CR, D or F grading for make-up examinations; possible misuse of permission for late examinations. Dean Desiderio asked the faculty to submit grades to Camp before posting, and he explained some difficulties caused by unreasonably late submission of grades.

Dean Desiderio complimented the Honors and Awards Committee for its work and organization of the extremely enjoyable Awards Banquet.

Offering Sheets for next academic year were distributed. The faculty approved the recommendation of the Curriculum Committee that curriculum be accepted. (Edited Offering Sheets attached)

Parnall solicited help in lining up Advocacy tutors for the fall semester.

There was a suggestion by Goldberg that the faculty should be alert as to the use in their names of the auditorium in the law library.
