MINUTES

Goldberg presented to the faculty New Mexico Speaker of the House Gene Samberson's proposed amendment to the Constitution (Article VI, Sec. 1), which might overturn the current common law system by having the Legislature, rather than the Supreme Court, determine what is procedural and what is substantive law.

Simson thanked the faculty advisers for their work with the Client Counseling Competition. The two winners at this school, Alcock and Hertz, also conveyed their thanks to the faculty.
