The meeting was called to order by Dean Desiderio; minutes of the meeting of April 27, 1981, were approved.

The Dean announced that the law school heating and cooling system is to be redesigned, the work on which may cause some disruptions for the next several months.

A recent meeting of the Alumni Association resulted in the news that an additional \$2,000.00 is now available in the Student Emergency Loan Fund; that \$1000, will be available for guest lecturer(s); and that the Association is planning a research project program for law students, as well as a program to invite third year students to one luncheon each semester. So great is the desire to aid the law school that a total of \$7500.00 has been allocated for these projects.

The main agenda item of the Curriculum Committee's proposal for next year's curriculum was discussed and adopted, with the following amendments:

- It is the sense of the faculty that the Committee should explore the feasibility of placing Advocacy in the spring semester, 1982-83.
- The first year elective in the spring semester will be a true elective, limited by scheduling restrictions; thus, students wanting to be included in clinical lotteries for summer 1982 should take at least a two-hour elective.
- The Legal Analysis course will be included in the schedule of the Programmed Studies students.

Winograd asked that faculty members notify him immediately, for purposes of scheduling, as to the courses which will be open to first year students and those which will not be open for them.

The Honors and Awards Committee recommended David Bell for the Wall Street Student Achievement Award. Motion carried.

Future faculty meetings will be called as needed. Meeting adjourned.
