## MINUTES

Dean thanked and congratulated Professor Simson for the fine performances of students in the Client Counseling Competition. The two students who will represent the Law School at Little Rock are Bruce Cline and Ella Frank.

Professor Ellis will conduct the colloquium next Monday at 4:00 in the faculty lounge. His topic will be the American Bar Association's standard for using mental incompetency as a criminal defense.
