Dean Parnall introduced former law student Gary Armstrong and his attorney, Mr. James Toulouse. The two appeared to present Mr. Armstrong's case for reconsideration of his request for readmission to the law school and award of a Juris Doctor degree, which the faculty had previously denied in April, 1984.

Materials and documents relevant to the case, prepared by Mr. Toulouse, had been furnished the faculty as an attachment to Dean Parnall's 20 October 1986 memo, subject: Gary Armstrong Appeal.

Mr. Toulouse presented a recapitulation of events of the case and an appeal (as outlined in his cover memo to the case materials) that his client be readmitted to the School of Law and awarded a Juris Doctor degree. After his presentation he opened the meeting for questions from the faculty to either himself or his client. At approximately 5PM the two left the room to permit the faculty to discuss the case.

After discussion, the faculty, upon proper motion and second, voted to deny Mr. Armstrong's petition for reconsideration of the April, 1984 action denying him readmission or awarding a degree.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:50 PM.
