The meeting was called to order by Dean Leo Romero.

A motion was made by Professor Ann Scales and seconded by Professor Mike Norwood to approve the minutes of the March 20, 1995, faculty meeting as distributed. When voted on, the motion carried.

Curriculum Committee Report:

Professor Mike Norwood distributed the revised 1995-96 curriculum (attached) to the faculty for their approval. The Committee recommended that the ethics requirement be fulfilled in conjunction with the clinic requirement and that adjunct professors be used to teach the competitions. Dean Romero stated that only five competitions can be supported by the Law School. The Committee recommended that the following five competitions receive academic credit--the moot court competition, the mock trial competition, the environmental moot court competition, the health law moot court competition, and the international moot court competition. Dean Romero also stated that he had met with Professor Norwood to ensure that core courses would be staffed with full-time faculty. The teaching load of the writing director was discussed at length in view of the expectations of the faculty with regard to program development and one-on-one remedial work with students. After discussion of the report of the Curriculum Committee, Professor Ted Occhialino moved that in order to assure that the curricular needs of the law school are met, each full-time faculty member must accept one teaching assignment per academic year at the request of the Curriculum Committee independent of the preference of the faculty member. If fewer than all faculty in any given academic year are called upon to take such an assignment, those faculty who are not called upon to accept such an assignment in one year shall be first called upon in the following year(s) to accept such an assignment so that all faculty share equally in the responsibility to assure that curricular needs are met. Exceptions to this rule shall be rare and shall occur only on a 2/3 vote of the entire faculty. The motion was seconded by Professor Margaret Montoya. Professor Ted Occhialino then moved to table this motion until the next regularly scheduled faculty meeting. The motion was seconded by Professor Margaret Montoya.

Dean Romero then called the question, and when the Curriculum Committee report was voted on, it was approved by the faculty.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:45 p.m.
