After proper motion and second, the minutes of the October 9, 1995, meeting were approved as distributed.

Dean's Report:

Professor Rob Schwartz has been named the inaugural Arthur Grayson Distinguished Visiting Professor of Law and Medicine at Southern Illinois University for the 1996-97 academic year.

Dean Romero reported that the Distinguished Alumni Achievement Awards Dinner, held October 20, 1995, was well attended; the total attendance was 369, including 18 members of the Law School faculty.

The Law School has been notified of an award of \$45,000 from the Hatton W. Sumners Foundation for a series of three symposia to be held in the 1996-1997 academic year. The three symposia will be on Water Law, Tribal Tax, and Children's Advocacy.

The New Mexico Hispanic Bar Association, the Barra y Colegio de Abogados de Ciudad Juarez, the Universidad Autonoma de Ciudad Juarez, and the U.S.-Mexico Conflict Resolution Center are presenting a seminar entitled, "Encuentros: A Meeting of Mexican and U.S. Attorneys." This seminar will be held November 2, 3, and 4, 1995, in Ciudad Juarez, Mexico. Professors Antoinette Sedillo Lopez and Scott Taylor are listed among the U.S. Faculty for the seminar.

Professor Margaret Montoya participated as a panelist in the Hispanic National Bar Association/Latino Law Professor Annual Conference in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

The Simms Lecture, given by Professor Peter L. Arenella, will be held Thursday, November 2, at 7:30 p.m. in the Nursing/Pharmacy Lecture Hall.

The Indian Law Symposium, "Unique Issues in Teaching Indian Law and Developing Indian Law Clinics," will be held on November 16, 17, and 18, 1995. The first day of the symposium will be at the Pueblo of Isleta. Days two and three will be at the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center.


Professor Barbara Bergman announced the Faculty Curriculum Discussion Dinner following the Faculty Meeting in the Dean's Conference Room.
